- Share opportunities for parents to volunteer and participate in the classroom or school
- Outline the responsibilities of students, parents, and teachers in the educational process

Roles of the School and Teacher

Abita Springs Elementary teachers will communicate effectively with their students and families to support students' success in English/ Language Arts and Math.

Our teachers and classrooms will:

- Present classroom specific information to parents annually at Open House or online
- Maintain updated school and teacher websites to keep parents informed
- Send home weekly newsletters
- Utilize parent/teacher communication folders
- Prepare and execute lessons aligned with the Louisiana State Standards
- Provide a safe and orderly learning environment
- Provide on-going reports about each child's academic progress
- Encourage and support all students in their efforts to achieve success
- Identify struggling students and provide remediation for students performing below level

Roles of the Parent

Abita Springs Elementary parents will collaborate with the school and teachers in order to extend learning opportunities from the classroom into the home environment.

As parents, your responsibilities will be to:

- Ensure your child is on time and attends school regularly
- Make sure that homework is completed
- Participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to your children's education
- Promote positive use of your child's extracurricular time
- Stay informed about your child's education and communicate with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school or the school district either received by your child or by mail and responding, as appropriate
- Communicate with teachers, staff, and administrators through notes, conferences, class visits, volunteering, and website/email regarding the well-being of your child
- Monitor your child's progress by checking JPAMS, and reviewing report cards
- Encourage your child to do his/her best academically, behaviorally, and socially

Roles of the Students

Abita Springs Elementary students will join the school, teachers, and parents in taking an active role in ensuring their own success.

- I will read at least 30 minutes every day outside of school time.

Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goal

Implement a comprehensive academic program which assesses readiness and advancement in grades Pre-K through 12, providing the opportunity for student learning to culminate college and career readiness.

School Goals

ELA- By 2025, 75% of students will be performing at grade-level in English/Language Arts.

- K-2 ELA skills will be measured by the percentage of students achieving “Benchmark” scores on the End-of-Year DIBELS Assessment.
- Grade 3 ELA will be measured by the percentage of students achieving scores of “Mastery” or “Advanced” on the LEAP 2025 Assessment.

Math Goal- By 2025, 80% of students will be performing at grade-level in Math.

- K-2 math will be measured by the percentage of students scoring 75% correct or greater on District Created End-of-Year SLT Mastery Assessments.
- Grade 3 math will be measured by the percentage of students achieving scores of “Mastery” or “Advanced” on the LEAP 2025 Assessment.
